- part of the accumulated profit for the year 2014 in the amount of EUR 3,645,495.30 EUR shall be used for the payment of dividends (EUR 0.15 gross per share),
- the remainder of the accumulated profit in the amount of EUR 573,995.25 shall remain unappropriated.

All shareholders registered in the Share Register as at July 8th 2015 shall be entitled to a dividend. Dividend is scheduled for payment within 45 business days following the adoption of the present resolution."

Explanation of the shareholder:

"My counter-proposal is referring to the payment of dividends in the amount of EUR 0.15 gross per share, as it was several years ago. I'm justifying my proposal, that this proposal will reinforce confidence in the Gorenje Group itself as in the Gorenje share, and thus indirectly on the business operations and reputation of the company in Europe and in the world. With this you will give to the wider part of Slovenia a sign that the economic upturn is in sight, and that everything is not so black as it seems."
